<b>10a</b> A smooth or rough coating on low shore rocks.	<b>SEAWEEDS</b>	<b>82</b>
<b>10b</b> Various other hard, stone-like structures.	Go to 11	
<b>11a</b> Stone-like nodules, plates or finely-branched articulated structures.	<b>SEAWEEDS</b>	<b>82</b>
<b>11b</b> Stone-like tubes cemented to rock or seaweed, elongate, curvaceous or spiral.	<b>WORMS</b>	<b>20</b>
<b>12a</b> Plants.	Go to 13	
<b>12b</b> Animals.	Go to 14	
<b>13a</b> In the sea; non-flowering plants.	<b>SEAWEEDS</b>	<b>82</b>
<b>13b</b> Usually out of the sea; flowering plants.	<b>WILDFLOWERS</b>	<b>97</b>
<b>14a</b> Fixed in place.	Go to 15	
<b>14b</b> Free to move around.	Go to 17	
<b>15a</b> 1-2 cm, with a one terminal ‘spout’ and no tentacles.	<b>SPONGES</b>	<b>8</b>
<b>15b</b> 1-20 cm, either with two ‘spouts’ or with tentacles.	Go to 16	
<b>16a</b> Has tentacles.	<b>SEA ANEMONES</b>	<b>12</b>
<b>16b</b> Has two ‘spouts’.	<b>SEA SQUIRTS</b>	<b>72</b>
<b>17a</b> Has no walking legs or feet.	Go to 18	
<b>17b</b> Has legs, or has a foot or feet without legs.	Go to 21	
<b>18a</b> Wiggles on the sea bed.	<b>WORMS</b>	<b>20</b>
<b>18b</b> Swims in the water column.	Go to 19	
<b>19a</b> Swims by flexing domed jelly body or comb-rows.	<b>JELLYFISH</b>	<b>12</b>
<b>19b</b> Swims with fins.	Go to 20	
<b>20a</b> Skin rough when stroked tail-head direction.	<b>CATSHARK</b>	<b>76</b>
<b>20b</b> Skin smooth and shiny, usually scaly.	<b>BONY FISHES</b>	<b>76</b>
<b>21a</b> Has a foot or feet, but no legs.	Go to 22	
<b>21b</b> Has recognisable leg-like appendages.	Go to 23	
<b>22a</b> Single muscular foot (slugs & snails).	<b>MOLLUSCS</b>	<b>26</b>
<b>21b</b> Numerous tube feet (starfish etc.).	<b>ECHINODERMS</b>	<b>68</b>
<b>23a</b> Legs no more than bristles attached to a pair of muscular lobes per segment or leaf-like paddles.	<b>WORMS</b>	<b>20</b>
<b>23b</b> Has articulated walking legs.	Go to 24	
<b>24a</b> Legs three pairs.	<b>INSECTS</b>	<b>64</b>
<b>24b</b> Legs five or more pairs.	Go to 25	
<b>25a</b> Body wormlike; legs similar, one pair on each of many similar segments.	<b>CENTIPEDE</b>	<b>64</b>
<b>25b</b> Body form various, legs also various (crab, lobster, shrimp, prawn etc.).	<b>CRUSTACEANS</b>	<b>52</b>
